

SNOODLES

Head:

- Cut a 9 inch square of muslin
- Take several pieces of batting scraps and wrap them into a tight 2 and 1/2 inch ball. Wrap the muslin around the ball and tie it tightly very close to the ball with a scrap of fabric or string or yarn

Snoodle:

- Cut flannel into 15-inch to 18-inch squares (size can vary)
- Fold a flannel piece in half diagonally, right sides together, to make a triangle. Sew a seam around the raw edges, leaving a 4-inch opening on one side
- Turn the flannel right side out and push the corners and sides out smoothly with a pen or chopstick or something with a dull point. Find the center of the long folded side and place a pin there
- Push the “head” through the opening in the flannel square and pin it to the center that was marked
- Fold the edges of the opening inside, even with the seam. Topstitch around the outside of the flannel piece
- Gather the flannel body around the “head” piece and tie tightly with a ribbon
- Tie a knot in each of the “hands” of the Snoodle
